

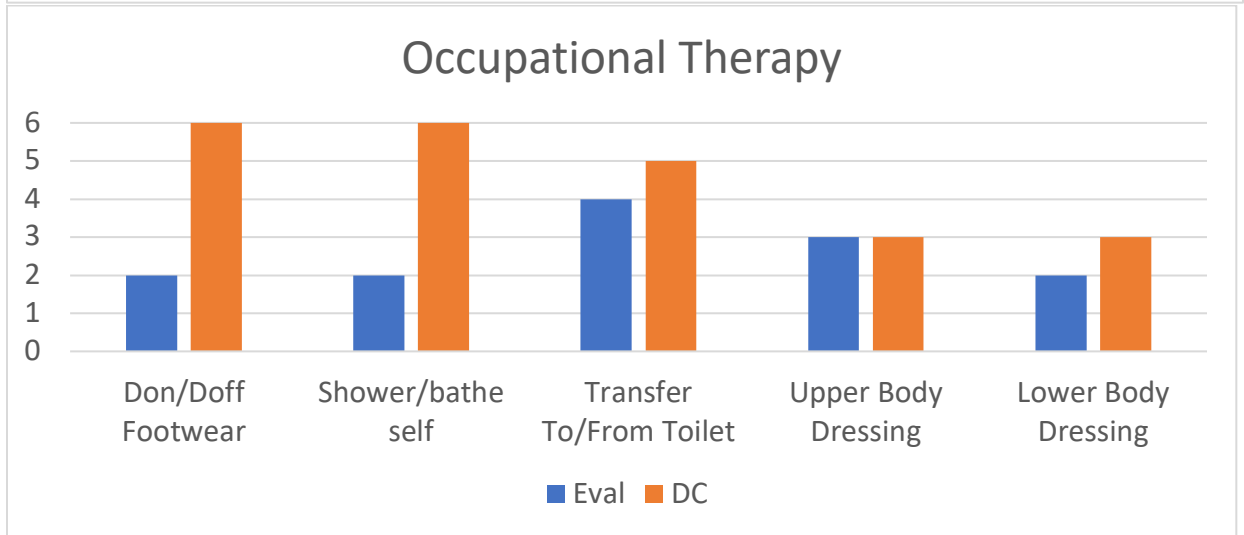
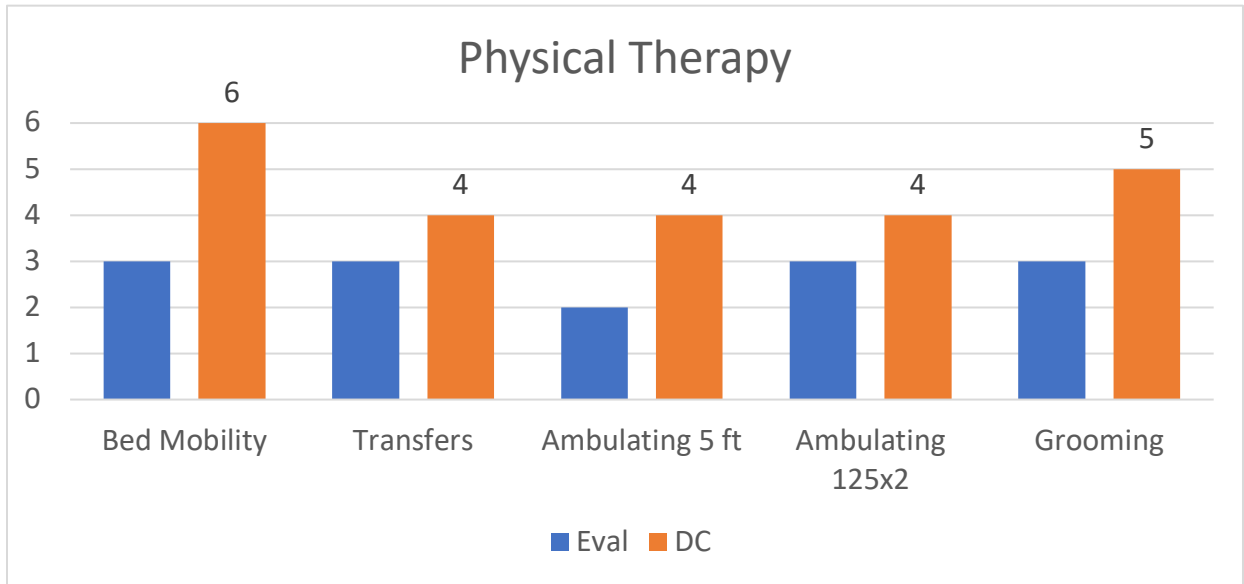
OUTCOMES MATTER

Mrs. Tull is a 96-year-old female who was admitted to the hospital on 7-27-24 due to GLF. Pt sustained a Lt femoral neck fracture and is s/p ORIF. After Mrs. Tull's hospital stay, she was admitted to Arbrook Plaza Nursing and Rehab Center on 7/31/2024. Mrs. Tull also presents with a past medical history of hypertension, CHF, a history of DVTs, and a recent fall due to generalized weakness.

PT/OT evaluated Mrs. Tull on 8/1/2024, with the plan to improve lower and upper extremities strength, improve balance, safety awareness to decrease falls, and improve ADLs participation. For her to return home with her husband. Mrs. Tull's initial treatment levels were at **maximal assistance** due to pain, weakness, and contraindications from the fracture. Being 96 is just a number for Mrs. Tull. She was determined to get out of bed daily and do what was needed of her to get stronger. Her willpower and positive attitude in working with the therapists and nursing team contributed to her quick recovery at Arbrook Plaza. By the end of her stay, Mrs. Tull was ambulating 60 -125 ft with a FWW with CGA.

Barely a little over 2 weeks at Arbrook Plaza Nursing and Rehab, Mrs. Tull demonstrated substantial improvement in all categories! She went from Moderate/**Max Assistance** required for all functional mobility, transfers, and ADLs, to **Minimal assistance and contact guard assist**. Mrs. Tull was safely discharged home with her husband. She is highly motivated, and we hope she stays safe!!





| MDS Section GG Functional Scores | |
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| 06 - Independent | Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper |
| 05 - Setup or clean-up assistance | Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity. |
| 04 - Supervision or touching assistance | Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently. |
| 03 - Partial/moderate assistance | Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs but provides less than half the effort. |
| 02 - Substantial/maximal assistance | Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort. |
| 01 - Dependent | Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity. |
